Welcome!

Hello, I'm **FadaBarto**, and in this lesson, I'll guide you through the **basics of playing guitar**, especially if you're starting from scratch. You'll learn about the types of guitars, their parts, how strings work, and how to play your **first 3 chords**: **C Major**, **F Major**, and **G Major**. By the end, you'll be able to play simple songs like **"Take Glory Father"** using just these chords.

Types of Guitars

1. Acoustic Guitar

- o Produces sound naturally.
- Can't be connected to an amplifier.
- Great for practice or small gatherings.

2. Electric Guitar

- Needs an amplifier to produce sound.
- Used in stage performance or band settings.

3. Semi-Acoustic Guitar

- A combination of both.
- o Can play like an acoustic guitar but also connect to an amp.
- Ideal for beginners and performers.

Parts of the Guitar

- **Head** Contains the tuners for adjusting string tension.
- Neck The long part where you press strings and find frets.
- **Body** Produces the sound; includes the sound hole or electronics.
- Strings There are 6 strings, numbered from bottom (thinnest) to top (thickest):

1st: E, 2nd: B, 3rd: G, 4th: D, 5th: A, 6th: E

Understanding Frets & Strings

- **Frets**: Metal strips on the neck. Pressing a string behind a fret changes the sound (pitch).
- String Notes (from top to bottom):

6th: E (thickest)

o 5th: A

o 4th: D


- o 3rd: G
- o 2nd: B
- 1st: E (thinnest)

🖐 Playing Posture & Hand Use

- Right-handed players:
 - Right hand = Strumming
 - Left hand = Fretting/pressing strings
- Fingers:
 - Thumb (not numbered)
 - o Index = Finger 1
 - o Middle = Finger 2
 - o Ring = Finger 3
 - o Pinky = Finger 4
- **Tip**: Keep your fingers curved. Don't press with your nails, and try not to touch other strings.


7 Your First 3 Chords

C Major Chord




- Finger 1: 2nd string (B), 1st fret
- Finger 2: 4th string (D), 2nd fret
- Finger 3: 5th string (A), 3rd fret
- Do not play the 6th string
- Strings 1, 3 = open (played without pressing)

2 F Major Chord



- Finger 1: Press down strings 1 & 2 at 1st fret (barre)
- Finger 2: 3rd string (G), 2nd fret
- Finger 3: 4th string (D), 3rd fret
- Play from 4th string downward (don't strum strings 5 and 6)

3 G Major Chord



- Finger 2: 5th string (A), 2nd fret
- Finger 3: 6th string (E), 3rd fret
- Finger 4: 1st string (E), 3rd fret
- Strings 2, 3, and 4 = open

Practice Tips

- Pain is normal when you're just starting out. Your fingertips will toughen over time.
- Avoid muted notes by making sure your fingers don't touch neighboring strings.
- Keep the guitar **upright and flat** on your lap, not facing you.
- Use your **fingertips**, not the pads.

Practice Song Example

You can already play simple songs like:

"Take Glory Father"

Play: $C \rightarrow F \rightarrow G \rightarrow C$

Take glory, Father...

Take glory, Son...

Take glory, Holy Ghost...

Now and forever more...

You've just used real chords to accompany singing!

- Practice C, F, and G chords daily
- Try switching between them smoothly
